

# **2017 MAYB: Colorado End of Summer Classic**

We have a 5 game minimum; however some teams will play more. We will attempt to schedule all games within a few hours of each other to avoid any long lay-offs. Please have grade cards for all players available.

**All coaches must sign in and leave a contact number before the start of their first game. You will also receive your 2 coaches passes at this time.**

## **Admission Fees:**

Admission fees are used for gym rental fees and referee costs; we must charge spectators admission to the tournament. ***Please communicate this to your parents!***

- Adults: \$7 daily / \$12 weekend pass (both are good at all gyms)
- Students (18 and under): \$5 daily / \$8 weekend pass (both are good at all gyms)
- Children under 5 are admitted free

All Teams will get a total of TWO (2) passes, which can be used for coaches, managers, etc... Admission fees will be charged for any additional team personnel.

## **Scorekeeping:**

All teams must provide an adult to help at the scorer's table for each game. Please have your person selected and ready at the end of the previous game. Please be respectful of this request, as it will go a long way towards keeping games on time.

## **Tournament Rules:**

Complete tournament rules will be provided on all scorer's tables and at the admission table. Below are a few rules to keep in mind:

- Games will be two (2) 20 minute halves. It is a running clock, except for the last two minutes of BOTH halves. Clock will not stop if there is a lead of 15 points or greater.
- The first overtime will be 2 minutes (stop clock), and the second overtime will be sudden death, with the first team scoring 1 point wins (free throws count).
- Coaches get four (4) timeouts per game (all 30 seconds), which can be used at any time. No timeouts carry over for OVERTIME. Each team will get one (1) in Overtime.
- Colorado High School rules apply. Coaches and/or players ejected from contests will miss, at a minimum, the next game, and possibly more at the director's discretion and the officials of the contest at questions.
- Teams can protest a player on his/her grade level before the game only.
- *Please see brackets for Tiebreaker format.*

## **Miscellaneous:**

- If you are playing in the first game of the day (5pm Friday or 8am/9am on Saturday and Sunday) the gym WILL NOT be open until 30 minutes prior to the game time.
- ***ALWAYS check the game schedules posted on the wall throughout tournament in case of any changes. REMEMBER the wall brackets are final! Please communicate this to your parents.***

## Tournament Regulations & Guidelines

1. Players may play on only one team within a tournament age group. Players may play “up” in an older age group. This could mean a player plays in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade tournament and the 9<sup>th</sup>/10<sup>th</sup> grade division. But they can’t play on 2 teams in the same 8<sup>th</sup> grade tournament.
2. All roster changes made after the entry deadline should be given to the tournament director before playing a game at a specific tournament. Grade cards will still be used to determine eligibility. Final eligibility rulings will be made by the tournament director if weekend conflicts occur. There is no way for the National Office to make these decisions. If you know players will be gone, plan ahead! We want everyone to be able to play, but we do not want teams bringing in players on Sunday because they feel it is the only way to win the tournament.
3. Each tournament building will have a Site Director. Please direct questions to this individual during the weekend or you can contact the Tournament Directors.

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## SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT

Any parent or spectator that receives a technical foul or disrupts the game of play will automatically be disqualified from watching the remainder of play for the weekend. Play will be stopped until the parent removes themselves from the facility and failure to do so will result in automatic forfeit of the team from that game and all remaining games for the tournament.

The technical foul is assigned to the head coach. Two technical fouls assigned to the head coach follows the high school league rules of disqualification of that head coach for the remainder of that game, and will also be for the next game of play.

All spectators, coaches, and people attending the tournament are expected to represent themselves as a positive role model for the student-athletes. Any disruption on the premises (which includes the parking lot, hallways, and all areas of the facility) will result in disciplinary action against the individual(s) which could include suspension of the team, and termination of the individual(s) from watching the remainder of the tournament. Failure to conform will result in contacting of the authorities in the jurisdiction to enforce this code of conduct.
